East-South Christianity Shift

1970: 70% of Christians lived in the West

Today: 70% of Christians are non-western

- Welsh Revival (1904)

Charismatic Concerns

- Lack of emphasis on biblical authorities
- False prophecies or claims coming from God
- Heretical off-shoots

- Modernists / Liberal Theology
- Fundamentalist / Conservative Theology
- Evangelical / Ecumenical Theology

Primary Tenants of Evangelicalism

- Christian theology must be rooted in Scripture
- Distinguishing cardinal doctrines from doctrines of secondary importance

Evangelical Missions

- Introduction of the idea of People Groups
- Focus changes from spiritual issues of a country to those of people groups in a country

People Groups Worldwide

- Today, there are a total of 17,468 people groups;
- 7,419 are labeled "unreached" (41%), containing 3.2 billion people.



Concerns

- Mission boards shifted from requiring marriage to sending singles
- Women's Rights Movement coincided with the Women's Missionary Movement
- Lack of family structure produced poor church structure

Single Missionaries

- 1/3 of missionaries are single
- Of those, 80% are single missionary women




